I can't remember any of the appeals that Shannon's done with me that we've ever lost. I met Shannon in one of the most contentious cases in all of central Florida. I'm amazed by Shannon's memory and ability to remember cases right on her fingertips. Her writing skills are second to none. I happen to know that Shannon has been well-recognized amongst family lawyers, enhancing our ability to understand what's necessary in preparing a case for an appeal. Shannon and I collaborated on a very controversial case where we were in the unenviable position of asking that a judge be removed from a case for bias and prejudice. Lawyers in general are loath to take on such a journey because they are fearful that in the future they'll have to walk in and face that judge again. Shannon never expressed any fear of that, and the two of us worked really hard together, and ultimately we've got the appellate court to in fact write an opinion to the effect that the judge had to remove herself from hearing the case. It felt good for the client because our position was just.
